Dr. Johns has been a great asset to the Aultman Healthcare Delivery System and surrounding community for over 35 years. Dr. Johns is the

medical director of Sports Medicine and Therapy. In this role, he has served as team physician for Canton McKinley High School for 34+ years including injury evaluation, treatment, follow-up care and athletic physicals. Additionally, he has also provided coverage as the team physician or site physician for the Canton Charge, NFL Alumni Academy, Pro Football Hall of Fame game, enshrinement, concert, marathon and OHSAA Football State Championships. Recently, he became the Malone University Student Health physician. He worked with Aultman Sports Medicine and implemented a Concussion Management Program. This year, with all the challenges of COVID-19, he has spent countless hours working with our local health departments, athletic trainers, athletic programs and high school and university administrators.

Since becoming the medical director of the Therapy Collaborative in 2017, Dr. Johns has been instrumental in several achievements that have benefited our patients by advancing quality therapy care. Dr. Johns has been committed to educating therapists and physicians alike on best practice management of problematic musculoskeletal conditions such as frozen shoulder and low back pain. #### **Dr. Nihad Boutros**

- Received his medical degree from Damascus University, Syria, in 1988
- Completed internal medicine residency at Case Western Reserve University in 1994
- Completed fellowships in pulmonary critical care at the University of Missouri in 1998 and critical care medicine at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center in 1999
- Board certified in critical care medicine and pulmonary medicine
- Joined Aultman's staff in 2003

Dr. Boutros has been the medical director of Critical Care Services at Aultman Hospital since 2005. Early in his career at Aultman Hospital, he promoted the Critical Care Services as a major program/service line with a strong team of physicians. Since joining the Aultman team, he has demonstrated a passion and commitment to excellence. Areas of improvement during Dr. Boutros's leadership include:

- 45% reduction in Code Blue events.
- 50% increase compliance with sepsis gold standard care
- Better than national average with ICU mortality, ICU length of stay, ventilator days and ICU therapy levels.
- Dr. Boutros has also been instrumental in establishing our critical care APRN team and rapid response team.

Most recently, Dr. Boutros has been the COVID-19 physician champion, leading COVID-19 efforts through Aultman. Through his leadership, COVID-19 protocols and standards of care have been established that have led the organization to better than national average COVID ICU patient outcomes. He also provided insight in the implementation of our isolation unit. Dr. Boutros has also met with entity providers to share knowledge and expertise related to COVID-19. Most recently, he served as the primary investigator for the Mayo Clinic's convalescent plasma study, which allowed cutting-edge treatment therapies to our COVID-19 patients.

He is patient-centric, treating every patient as if they were his own family member. Dr. Boutros's passion transcends through his partnership and support of others to drive excellence for the mission of critical care to deliver high-quality, evidenced-based compassionate care to the injured and critically ill patients in our community.
