

Surgery for Lung Cancer: Who & How?

- Discuss breast cancer disparities related to screening, prevention & treatment.
- Identify actions to reduce disparities in breast cancer.
- Understand past data that led to surgical de-escalations in the contemporary management of melanoma.
- Discuss the standard systemic melanoma treatments & how they have impacted surgical care.
- Consider ongoing efforts to further personalize melanoma surgery.
- Understand the new technologies available to help treat head & neck cancer patients.
- Better understand strategies involved in adopting new technologies.
- Better understand the concepts of value-based medicine.
- Understand the fundamentals of transoral robotic surgery.
- Recognize potential for appropriate integration of transoral robotic surgery for treatment of certain head & neck cancers.
- Describe the evidence for lifestyle medicine in cancer care.
- Explain the role of lifestyle changes in prevention & treatment of cancer.
- Understand the importance of early lung cancer detection through screening.
- Identify candidates for lung screening.
- Discuss staging and diagnosis in lung cancer.
- Review surgical treatment options for lung cancer.
